



# FAQ

### How does the Lucky Loser sign-in work?

Once the Qualifying is finished, the order of the Lucky Loser will be randomly drawn among those who lost in the Qualifying final. Ranked players will be drawn first, then the unranked players. Players who lost in the previous round come thereafter and so on.

If there is a free position for the main draw (withdraw from the main draw after the qualifying has started), the lucky losers move directly into the main draw. This is an automatic process and there is currently no obligation to register. If you do not want to take a possible lucky loser spot, please inform the referee immediately after your qualifying match.

If there is a free position later, Lucky Losers will take that position when they sign in at the Lucky Loser list of the day in the referee's office. The list of lucky losers ends 30 minutes before the planed start of the first match in the respective draw. The exact time will be published on the schedule of the day. The same order as in the previous drawing is used.

The registration lists for Lucky Loser will be available until every player has played his first match.

### Can I call the physical therapist during the game?

Yeah, there's a PT on site. For additional treatments and massages before and after the games, please contact the tournament office.

# Do I have to wear the same colored shirt as my doubles partner?

No, this rule is no longer part of the ITF Junior Tour Rulebook.
